Greetings, People of God!

This time last month I was in Sarasota, FL with some of the youth from our congregation and synod, working on relief efforts in the wake of the massive destruction from Hurricane Ian. We also spent some time at the local beach both for recreation and for a worship service led by the pastor of our host church—a service which turned out to be an incredible witness to the other beach-goers. Still, as I'm starting to pack for a week at Sequanota, the Florida trip is beginning to feel like a distant memory.

Except for the sand. Now, the beach is never my first choice of vacation destinations. I get sunburned really easily. I don't love being sticky from the salt water, sandy from the beach, or sweaty from the heat. I prefer not to swim where I can't see what else might be swimming with me. Even after nearly a month of unpacking and doing laundry, I still feel like I haven't gotten rid of the sand. My beach bag—still a little sandy. My shoes—still a little sandy. My sunscreen—still a little sticky...and sandy.

Jesus describes the kingdom of God using metaphors similar to that sand: start with just a little bit of it, and soon you find that it is everywhere. Just like sand can be an irritant, Jesus describes the kingdom as being a little irritating, too. The gospel comforts, but then sometimes it calls us to do work that takes us outside of our comfort zone.

As we study scripture together, I hope the good news of God's love brings us the peace that passes all understanding. I also hope that as the gospel sticks with us, every once in a while we come across an irritating little bit that motivates us to better help the world know that same love.




Blessing of Backpacks and Those Who Carry Them
