Dear People of God:

When teaching or preaching a passage that mentions religious persecution, I've often noted that in our nation, where we are guaranteed freedom of religious practice and freedom from an established state religion, and especially as Christians who are part of a cultural majority, we cannot fully understand what it's like for the government to interfere with the exercise of our faith. For ELCA Lutherans, other mainline Protestant denominations, and our Jewish siblings—all faith traditions that value the life, health, and well-being of women in decisions regarding reproductive healthcare—that is no longer the case. The recent ruling of the US Supreme Court now permits legislation that ignores those concerns. In this regard, the government is legally interfering with the free exercise of our religion. That this decision preceded our nation's celebration of Independence Day by not even a fortnight seems a particularly cruel irony.

Theologians of our denomination authored a position in this matter*, yet the individual beliefs of our members vary. So although the court's decision violates our official church teachings, I realize it may not challenge every Lutheran's personal views. Some folks will consider this a tragedy, others a triumph. But setting aside this specific issue and looking at the intersection of faith and the state in general, when Jesus had the opportunity to further his kingdom through political power, he declined (Matthew 4 & Luke 4). One could argue that the Christian Church's greatest failure at following Jesus' example lies in its long history of pursuing political power—very often with tragic results. God is love (1 John 4:8), and love never coerces or forces its own way.

We may be unaccustomed to government intervention in our religious practice, but we're hardly the first to experience that struggle, and God has never yet abandoned the Church. Church dogma and personal preferences aside, people are hurting and afraid, and so we are called to compassion.



Eagle Scout

Aaron Reynolds has been an active Boy Scout in St. Matthew's Troop 358, located in Martinsburg, PA, since 2016. After earning 43 merit badges, double the required amount, and 226 hours of community service total, Aaron Reynolds earned his Eagle Scout Award and Rank on October 7, 2021.

His Eagle Scout Project, which consisted of over 350 total community service hours among all participants, and over \$4,000 raised in total, was directed towards honoring a local man named Joseph Chonko, who died of heart problems in 2001.

Joseph grew up in the Martinsburg Area and attended Central High School, where he played various sports, including football, wrestling, track, and snowboarding. He also worked and volunteered at Camp Mantowagan for many years. For these reasons, Aaron's project raised \$1,275 for each Camp Mantowagan and the Central

High School Athletics Department. The money raised was put towards installing new AEDs (Automated External Defibrillator) in both locations. The AEDs serve as a precaution for future heart problems. The remaining funds, nearly totaling \$1,000, were then donated directly to the Joseph Chonko Memorial Foundation, which funds church camps and missions around the world.

The Foundation was set up in Joseph's name after his passing. Funds for this project were raised through a tradition called Wood Day. This was a tradition that was carried out by Joseph and his father while he was alive, and was continued by family and friends after his passing.

Wood Day was a day of cutting down, splitting, and drying out firewood to sell to people in need. As part of his project, Aaron organized wood day in 2021 and made it more profitable than it had ever been and raised awareness for the cause. After receiving his award, Aaron finalized his future plans.

Because of his scouting experience, Aaron discovered his future career. In the fall, Aaron will be attending UPJ to major in Secondary Education, specializing in English. Throughout his high school career, he was involved in Boy Scouts, FBLA (Future Business Leaders of America), NHS (National Honors Society),



Chorus, Select Choir, Jazz Band, and the musical program at NBC, where he was an ensemble member in "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown", and the Tinman in "The Wiz". He was also involved with a community volleyball league, and plays Piano and Guitar.
