



## **Dear People of God:**

In June I will pass two benchmarks as a pastor. First, having been ordained at the Allegheny Synod Assembly in 2012, this month marks my ninth year as a minister of Word and Sacrament. Second, as of this month I will have spent as much time serving at St. Matthew during COVID as before COVID.

I remember asking the call committee here how they would know, a year or two down the road, whether I ended up being the "right" person for this call. They (wisely, I thought) avoided naming any specific programs or performance goals and merely said that there would be some change and things would be different. I don't think we could have envisioned quite how different things would be, although that of course had very little to do with me and very much to do with a world-wide crisis and our ongoing response to it.

The future is beginning to look brighter as risk abates enough to ease restrictions. We continue to act cautiously out of care and concern for those who haven't yet completed a vaccination cycle or who are unable to receive that protection, especially younger children. But as we begin to move out of the most critically hazardous days, it is worth remembering that we are not going back to the way things were; we are discovering and participating in things being made new.

Over the centuries, God's people have weathered all sorts of storms and witnessed God's presence in ever-changing circumstances. After 40 years in the desert, the Israelites did not go back to Egypt, however often they claimed they wanted to. The generation that was exiled to Babylon was not the same generation that returned to Israel and Judah; the promised land was new to them—an entirely different home.


In a way, we can't go back either. This year has changed us, so as we come together again, we need to attend to who we are *now*, not who we remember being *then*. Yet as always, we live in hope, because God who proved faithful in our past walks with us in the present and promises to lead us into the future. Let us therefore go forward—not back—in good courage.

## A Stewardship Minute June 2021

Timothy was still a young man when he received a letter from the man we call St. Paul. In that letter Paul told Timothy how to conduct himself with the following words: "Let no one despise your youth, but set the believers an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." (I Timothy 4:12)

I call your attention to the words: "Set the believers an example in speech and conduct." On the night before our Savior was crucified, he showed love and humility by washing the feet of his followers. When finished he said, "I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you.' (John 13:15)

There is a story of a widow who was left with five children. She lived on a farm and taught her children how to work hard, how to serve God, and how to give oneself totally for the kingdom of God. She had an old-fashioned wooden coffee grinder that she used to save a healthy portion of her earnings. Each Sunday she would empty the grinder and take the money to worship as the family's offering to God.

This month's *Stewardship* points out that the power of her stewardship was memorable. She did what Paul told Timothy to do: "Set an example in speech and conduct, in love, in faith, in purity." As a result of her example, her children grew up into wonderful adults ... for it was of one who loved the Lord with heart, mind, soul, and strength.

**Prayer:** Stir up faithfulness and service in us, dear Lord, to the end that we may glorify you in the totality of our lives. **Amen**



## **HIGHLIGHTS BY COUNCIL IN MAY 2021**

- 1. Plans continue for 5 summer catechism events and Sunday school for 24 youth, nursery through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, starting with Rally Day in September.
- 2. Discussed progress of in-person worship that began on May 2.
- 3. Voted to approve the updated Child Protection Policy. Education sessions are planned for June.
- 4. The finance committee will evaluate the feasibility of making contributions to our missionary families, Holy Family Lutheran Church, Yellow Knife, NW and Rocky Boy Indian Reservation, Box Elder, MT.
- 5. Even though the Bishop was approached by the county emergency management officer to offer vaccine clinics in churches in Blair County, it was considered not to be safe since St. Matthew continues to limit access to our building for worship services and church activities at this time.

### <u>CHURCH PROJECTS – APPROVED IN 2020 – COMPLETED IN 2021</u>

#### <u>\$11,128:</u>

To replace the heating and air conditioning in the offices of Pastor Traci and Lori and in the lobby area outside of their offices.

#### <u>\$4,291:</u>

- 1) Install permanent posts and chains at the Grange parking lot to keep unauthorized vehicles from using the lot.
- 2) Install permanent posts in front of the two heat/air units on the north side of the building, adjacent to the parking lot, to protect from vehicle damage.
- 3) Install permanent posts in front of the new heat pump outside of the church offices, adjacent to the parking lot, to protect from vehicle damage.
- 4) Install a chain-link fence around the heat/air unit on the outside wall adjacent to the kitchen, to protect from vandalism and damage.

## PAYROLL PROTECTION PROGRAM – LOAN/GRANT

As a result of the coronavirus pandemic, the United States Congress passed the Cares Act in the Spring of 2020. As part of this Act, there was a loan program to help cover payroll, rent and utilities for small businesses and nonprofit organizations such as our church. In our case, as long as the loan was used for payroll and utilities the loan amount would be forgiven.

On April 20, 2020 the church applied for a \$20,000 loan. The church fulfilled its loan obligations, and on February 25, 2021 the loan was forgiven. The loan then became a grant and, therefore, does not have to be repaid.

This money was very useful as our expenses exceeded our Income.
