Greetings People of God:

This year, the beginning of our later-than-average Lenten season misses coinciding with the beginning of March by just one day. March also brings us the official start of Spring, the change to Daylight Savings Time, and, if our clairvoyant rodent friend is to be believed, the warmer weather ending our six additional weeks of winter. Although I appreciate the snow for skiing, I struggle with the shorter, darker days of winter, and I resent the single digit temperatures that have often kept me indoors, deprived of the vitamin D available on those bright but still too frigid sunny days. I am ready for the change of seasons.

Since the focus of Lent is repentance, its timing for us in the Northern Hemisphere is just about perfect. Lent is usually portrayed as a somber season for feeling sorrowful regret for sin; yet repentance is not mainly about how we feel but what we do—turning away from sinful patterns and toward a more godly way of life. We are meant to experience joy in repentance, turning to follow God's call, in the same way we experience the joy of the seasons turning from the cold, dark, deadly weather of winter to the warmer, brighter spring when the life that has been lying dormant begins to bloom again.

As we hear God's call and endeavor to turn toward it, may we experience this Lent as an opportunity for joy, leaving behind what leads to death and pursuing the life that God desires for us.

A Stewardship Moment March 2022

"You shall freely open your hand to your brother, to your needy and poor in your land."

Deuteronomy 15:11

Once a pastor of a church that helped support those people needing help asked another pastor who worked daily with poor people, how his ministry was going. 
Volunteers Needed

When I was in the third grade, my grandparent's shoe and clothing business burned to the ground—literally. I distinctly remember standing on the parking lot with my family and seeing a big rectangle of thick, black ash. That was all that was left. We eventually found a few small items that

survived, but everything else was reduced to this pile of ash. I think about that day almost every Ash Wednesday as the black, sooty cross is traced on my forehead and I hear the words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return." I saw a tangible reminder of that fact after the fire that I carry with me. I also saw new life emerge from those ashes when the community came together to clean up and start over.

That's what Jesus does for us, too—cleans us up and gives us new life—a chance to start over when we've made a mess of things.

On Ash Wednesday, we face our own mortality—not only our physical death, but the "little deaths" all along the way as a result of our sin.

In The Invitation To Lent we hear, "We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance and for God's mercy. We are created to experience joy in communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. But our sinful rebellion separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, so that we do not enjoy the life our creator intended." Throughout this season we will be called through Scripture to be renewed in Christ and to share His love through praying, fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love. We will be assured of God's great love for us through Jesus' action on the cross.

I pray that in this season you will find rest and renewal; that your passion for sharing Christ's love will be rekindled and that you will know more fully the great love Jesus has for you.

CHURCH PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2021

- 1) \$1,200 for a new program controlling the use of key fobs, which are used to unlock the front doors.
- 2) \$3,600 to upgrade the audiovisual system in the Fellowship Hall. This project is not completely finished.
- 3) \$1,986 to install two air purifiers in the Sanctuary. These purifiers actively kill mold, bacteria and virus in the air and on surfaces.
- 4) \$7,550 to replace the Maple Street doors (which are the main entrance into the church). This project was paid for with a gift received from Ken Hoover and Anita Hoover in memory of their father Gerald Hoover.
- 5) \$3,070 to replace all ceiling lights in Pastor Traci and Lori's offices, as well as replacing the overhead exhaust fans in the upstairs bathrooms. This project was also paid for using the monetary gift received from Ken Hoover and Anita Hoover in memory of their father Gerald Hoover.

BENEVOLENCE

The last few years we have committed to Synod (Benevolence) the amount of \$26,000. This year we received from our congregation \$15,668 towards that commitment. The Church made up the difference of \$10,332.
