Greetings People of God!

If you read this as soon as the Messenger is available, we won't even have made it to Holy Week yet. This Easter falls almost as late as it can on the calendar, which means there is a good chance that we won't have to shovel snow to find Easter eggs this year (assuming with avian flu still spreading we can find eggs at all). Though frost on Easter morning is not unheard of, we in the Northern Hemisphere are used to celebrating Easter along with the coming of Spring, or at least with the hope that Spring is very near.

It is worth noting, however, that the new life of springtime makes an incomplete metaphor for the Resurrection. Although the predictions of groundhogs and the lions and lambs of March weather may make it seem like Spring will never arrive, we know that the earth's cycle will indeed continue as it always has. Quite the opposite, the Resurrection defies what we have always expected. None of the women or disciples who saw the empty tomb said, "Thank goodness that season of death is over and now we can get to the new life part." Jesus rising from the grave meant that God had done something entirely new.

The Resurrection goes against all logic and reason, which makes it hard to understand or believe. But that incredible power of the Resurrection gives us hope for a world that needs more than a couple tweaks to our current conditions or the patience to wait for a better phase in the cycle. Sometimes things get so broken, only Resurrection will do.

As we celebrate this Easter, may we give thanks for the God who is not limited by our logic, experience, or imagination, but can fulfill hopes we hardly dare to have.

Martinsburg Food Pantry






Mother's Day Banquet Sunday, May 11, 2025

1 tsp. baking powder 2 cups oatmeal 1 tsp. baking soda 1 cup coconut

2 cups Rice Krispies

Cream butter and sugars then add eggs and vanilla.

Add flour, baking powder and baking soda.

Last, add oatmeal, Rice Krispies and coconut.

Bake at 350 degrees for 10 minutes

THIRD CENTURY FUND (ENDOWMENT FUND)

The Third Century Fund continued to have good earnings year in 2024 and as a result has \$6,334.60 for distribution in 2025. You or your committee may request funding in writing by contacting Laura Orczeck, chairperson, or committee members: Allen Kuster, Barb Wilt, Beth Garner, or Pastor Traci.

Deadline to submit a request is Sunday, May 25, 2025. Funds will be distributed in June of 2025.

The following is from the by-laws of the Third Century Fund and outline the guidelines for fund requests.

PURPOSE

The St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund is established to encourage responsible Christian stewardship and to promote the mission of the congregation. In response to God's love and mercy, the Endowment Fund seeks to enhance and expand the mission outreach objectives of St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church. Members and friends of St. Matthew congregation are encouraged to practice responsible Christian Stewardship by making contributions to the Endowment Fund. There are a variety of ways such gifts can be made such as cash, securities, bequests through wills or living trusts, life insurance policies, charitable gift annuities and life estates. The Endowment Fund provides financial support for the church in a manner that is separate from the expenditures normally funded by the annual operating budget of the congregation.

USE OF THE FUND

All contributions to the St. Matthew Lutheran Church Endowment Fund will be undesignated and added to the principal balance of the fund. The Endowment fund principal balance will be retained and only the dividend income will be used for annual disbursements. Consideration for awarding fund requests will be given using the following guidelines:

- 1. Youth of all ages scholarship support of congregational members and their children; for youth events, for church camps or similar Christian programs, and education.
- 2. Christian outreach ministries and missions of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, its members, and the ELCA.
- 3. Worship and Music support for the worship of St. Matthew.
- 4. Capital Projects major renovations or building projects of St. Matthew.

You can sign up today on the sign-up sheet on the Narthex bulletin board or call the church office to let us know you would like to subscribe to the magazine.


The first expected issue to be mailed is Summer 2025. We will keep you updated.


Hello, this is Brandon Reynolds from Boy Scout Troop 358. As you may remember, I have been working to complete my Eagle Scout project. This project's aim was to improve the Northern Bedford High School's fencing team. The help you have given towards my project has greatly helped me complete the project.

To start, my project had 3 goals. The first was to raise at least \$3,500 for new fencing equipment, the second was to build shelves to store our equipment, and the third was to promote the sport further in the school. My project has now officially been completed with the final results. By the end of the project, there were more students involved in fencing, two 5-foot home made shelves installed in the school for the fencing team, and about \$5,200 available for new equipment.

The project was a great success due to your contributions and I have since earned my Eagle rank. The fencing team can now financially support itself and replace anything that is too old or broken, as well as afford anything that would improve the team.
