Dear People of God:

Nine years ago this month, nine members of Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC were killed by a white supremacist during bible study. Two of the victims were alumni of the ELCA's Southern Seminary. The shooter was a member of an ELCA congregation. Although I do not believe his church taught him to hate, his actions are a tragic reminder to all of us to *explicitly* teach and practice love and respect for all people, that all people are made in the image of God—an image that is not diminished because of race, gender, sexuality, ethnicity, disability, religion, nationality, or anything else.

You may have heard that an arrangement of the hymn "Lift Every Voice and Sing" (ELW#841) was removed from this spring's middle school concert because of complaints that it made people uncomfortable and was divisive. The issue was not that a religious song was being sung in a public school, as another hymn arrangement was kept in the program, but that this hymn, which alludes to the Old Testament narrative of Israel's captivity, has long been regarded as the unofficial Black national anthem, though in fact it does not make any reference to race.

While attending the annual preaching festival the week following the concert, I heard a wonderful sermon on Exodus that referenced "Lift Every Voice and Sing" and explored its themes of hope and unity. The preacher's main point was that because God made all of us, we're all on the same team; our lives are tied to one another—a prophetic message now that some states and school districts are either downplaying or simply not teaching historical events that oppressed minorities (slavery, Jim Crow, the Holocaust) lest those who see themselves as the majority feel uncomfortable. Yet a scriptural understanding of our oneness as God's children leads us to recognize that all history is "our" history, whether that is past history or the history that we're writing with our lives right now.

I invite you to join me in the fellowship hall on Monday, June 17th at 7PM to watch a recording of that powerful and relevant sermon, to sing "Lift Every Voice" and to pray that our community may bear unmistakable witness to God's love for all people.

A Stewardship Minute June 2024

A pastor was serving a struggling church in a large city. He had become a close friend of a sixtyplus-year-old unmarried man who was a member of the church. As the friendship developed, one day they began to discuss the subject of personal wills. For some reason this parishioner had never made a will!

Of course, failing to make a will was not wise because upon his death, his estate would be dispersed by government officials and possibly in a manner in which the man would not have approved. The pastor explained the importance of having a will, if for no other reason than to legally assure that the man's possessions would go to chosen relatives, friends, or worthy causes. The outcome of the discussion was that the man left half of his estate to his beloved church. Some two years after the man did have a will made, he was in a terrible automobile accident and died at age 67. His estate was worth two million dollars! Imagine the joy that surged through the hearts of the pastor and fellow parishioners. They were all given new hope.

Many of you may be thinking, "So what? That story is not relevant for me. I don't have a large estate. I don't need to make a will." We may know the worth of what we have right now and maybe it is not much, but none of us know what we may possess when our time on earth is over. It certainly would be wise to put in print our desires of where our goods are to go upon our death
