Greetings People of God!

This month of May will be full of transitions: Young members will be confirmed. Students and teachers will finish out another school year. Graduates will receive diplomas and move on to their next life chapter. Springtime blooms will give way to the lush green of summer. Liturgically, the Easter season will give way to the celebrations of Pentecost and Holy Trinity. I presume I'll finally be able to put away the flannel sheets and open the windows.

When so much is flux, we can be tempted to take the healthy practice of spring cleaning a little too far—tossing out what is still good and useful in favor of whatever is new and shiny. Yet scripture teaches us to care for what God has given us—each other and the very earth itself. To that end, we're trying a new project, the Mending Meal, to teach ourselves how to slow down, take stock, and practice the appreciation of God's abundance by restoring—instead of replacing—what we already have.

The Easter season makes us the promise of resurrection and new life, which we often think of as pertaining primarily to eternal life after death. But the resurrected Jesus spent 40 days interacting with his friends and followers in this world before ascending to the Father, teaching them (and us) that God's resurrecting power changes the way we understand and behave in this life. We, too, are called to not just believe in the future promise of resurrection but to live into the present reality of resurrection by practicing renewal now. What is God calling you to reconcile, restore, and renew?

An article in the May issue of *Stewardship* focuses on what might be called "Box Stewardship." Suppose that somewhere in the church we had several tables with boxes with different labels that might read: "Children's clothes." another "Girls and women's clothes," while still other boxes might be for kitchen and table goods, or lawn and garden materials. Members can then make donations of their belongings no longer used. The church arranged to have the donated items delivered on a monthly basis to a church-sponsored outlet that sells them for a small price. One church I know has a very large store that sells everything imaginable! The outlet store is run by volunteers. It is a cheery place just to visit, or to take items to.

Now listen to another story of an older layman in Oklahoma City who felt compelled to collect soft drink cans, take them to a company that buys metal items, and give the money received to his church. Soon many church members brought their empty cans to help the old fellow. In fact, they brought so many cans to him that he bought a trailer, put high sides on it, parked it on the church lot where people could deposit cans whenever they wished. When the trailer is full, he hooks it his car and goes to the metal buyer, gets the money earned and takes it to the church! This is creative stewardship. It is enhancing the kingdom of God by more than tithing; creating ways to work for God on a daily basis and finding the amazing joy that comes from such service.

Prayer: Creative Lord, help us to be the creative people you want us to be in order that your kingdom might be spread by our stewardship. **Amen**

Third Century Fund (Endowment Fund)

The Third Century Fund had a good earnings year in 2023 and as a result has \$6,072.30 for distribution in 2024. You or your committee may request funding in writing by contacting Laura Orczeck, chairperson, or committee members: Allen Kuster, Barb Wilt, Beth Garner, or Pastor Traci.

Deadline to submit a request is Sunday, May 26, 2024. Funds will be distributed in June 2024.

The following is from the by-laws of the Third Century Fund and outline the guidelines for fund requests.

PURPOSE

The St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund is established to encourage responsible Christian stewardship and to promote the mission of the congregation. In response to God's love and mercy, the Endowment Fund seeks to enhance and expand the mission outreach objectives of St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Members and friends of St. Matthew congregation are encouraged to practice responsible Christian Stewardship by making contributions to the Endowment Fund. There are a variety of ways such gifts can be made such as cash, securities, bequests through wills or living trusts, life insurance policies, charitable gift annuities and life estates.

The Endowment Fund provides financial support for the church in a manner that is separate from the expenditures normally funded by the annual operating budget of the congregation.

USE OF THE FUND


All contributions to the St. Matthew Lutheran Church Endowment Fund will be undesignated and added to the principal balance of the fund. The Endowment fund principal balance will be retained and only the dividend income will be used for annual disbursements.

Consideration for awarding fund requests will be given using the following guidelines:

1. Youth of all ages - scholarship support of congregational members and their children; for youth events, for church camps or similar Christian programs, and education.

2. Christian outreach ministries and missions of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, its members, and the ELCA.

- 3. Worship and Music support for the worship of St. Matthew.
- 4. Capital Projects major renovations or building projects of St. Matthew.
