Greetings People of God:

I have traveled to many beautiful places in the world, and I know I am biased, but I still say no place can compare to Pennsylvania in autumn. When I talk to former locals who now live in other parts of the country, they always want a status report on our leaves. Though still gorgeous, I admit this has not been the most brilliant season I've seen. Every year, it seems we have the same conversation: The weather was too hot (or cold) and dry (or rainy) for really good color. I'm approaching half a century of autumns, and I still don't know the weather recipe for the most stunning fall foliage.

Some years are objectively better than others. Side-by-side photos showed that 2020 was a singularly spectacular fall, while 2021 was lovely but average. Still, I think the effusive appreciation for the leaves of 2020 was partly because of pandemic closures forcing us outside more than in the years when we were free to gather indoors. It was not just a comparison of the colors but being there to notice the colors at all.

Celebrating Thanksgiving near the end of the year predisposes us to look back, and as we're counting our blessings, it's tempting to compare this year to previous years. Perhaps that's why scripture teaches the opposite: God commanded the Israelites to make an offering of thanksgiving from their first fruits—what they gathered at the beginning of the harvest, not the end. As well as a sign of trust in God's future provision, that first-fruits mentality allowed the people to practice gratitude in the present, without their thanksgiving devolving into an inventory or comparison.

I almost missed one truly lovely day this fall: the foliage overall hadn't been impressive, and I feared the leaves up the mountain were likely to be past their prime. But the dog wanted to hike (or so he said), so we went, and though it may not have been one for the record books, there were still hundreds of trees glowing with autumn colors. Scripture teaches us that although we are not perfect, we are still beloved of God. May we remember not to let perfect be the enemy of good, and may we learn to be thankful without envy or comparison.

Veteran's Day originated as "Armistice Day" on November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and November 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Veteran's Day is not to be confused with Memorial Day–a common misunderstanding, according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Memorial Day (the fourth Monday in May) honors American service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle, while Veteran's Day pays tribute to all American veterans–living or dead–but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

St. Matthew will honor veterans who have served in the military. Please check the list below of veterans who have served in the military. All veterans will be honored, including inactive and deceased. If you know of someone who is missing from the list, or you have a family member you wish to be honored during the service, please contact Jen in the church office as soon as possible.

The children clung to every word. Bible stories, prayers and memory verses, captivated their attention. They listened intently as we walked them through the week - Jesus' birth, His awe-inspiring miracles, His teachings, and finally, the heartwrenching story of His death and glorious resurrection.

"Why would they hurt Jesus? He didn't do anything wrong!" one child exclaimed. "That makes me feel really sad," sighed another.

Your generosity has made it possible for us to serve our Northern friends for 25 years, and continues to enable us to be a lasting presence.


