Greetings People of God:

At the end of the month we will observe Reformation Day, chosen for the traditional anniversary of Martin Luther posting his 95 Theses on the church door in Wittenberg on the Eve of All Saints Day (All Hallows Eve—Halloween), October 31, 1517. Of course, Luther didn't wake up that morning and think up 95 arguments against contemporary faith practices. He developed his disputations—and the volumes of theology that followed—after years of prayer, study, translation, worship, and conversation. On Reformation Sunday, we will commemorate his contributions to the Church by wearing red and singing A Mighty Fortress, but perhaps the best way to honor Luther's legacy is by study.

To that end, allow me to alert you to two learning opportunities in the month of October. First, we will meet every other Tuesday (October 3, 17, and 31) for bible study. In response to the survey conducted a few months ago, this study will meet in the Window Room with the option for Zoom online participation at 6:30PM. We will focus on the gospel readings for the following two upcoming Sundays. For something a little different, I also invite you to Camp Sequanota's Adult Day Workshop, Thursday, October 12, from 9-2:30. I'll be presenting on the topic of spiritual themes in Robert Frost's poetry. You can ask me for more details or call camp (814-629-6627) to make a reservation, which includes lunch.

9:30AM Sunday school has also resumed for the year. I hope you find a study that suits your needs and that, following the legacy of those who have gone before, you make life-long learning part of your faith practice.



- 1. Plans are underway for youth Sunday School and Peggy Steinfurth will be leading the adult class when she is available.
- 2. Registration is open for the December 8-10 Synod youth event. Parents will pay \$10, and St. Matthew will provide the remainder of the registration fee.
- 3. The social ministry committee is preparing for the Young at Heart luncheon on September 26.
- 4. Installation of the wheelchair platform lift into the fellowship hall has begun.
- 5. Proposals for the concrete work at the Maple Street entrance have been received and will be addressed by the property committee.
- 6. The church financial audit was completed by Barry Brumbaugh. All was found to be in good shape and the summary documents will be made available to the congregation.
- 7. Jennifer Ripka was hired to replace Lori Tremmel, who is retiring, and began orienting to her duties as administrative assistant.
- 8. Accepted Dr. Adam Smith's resignation as St. Matthew's pianist/accompanist effective in October with date to be determined. The position will be advertised.
- 9. Began reviewing the gift acceptance and use policy with the goal of having the congregation approve the finalized document at the December congregational meeting.
