Greetings People of God:

Several weeks ago I bought a book of patterns to knit hats inspired by the landscapes of the National Parks. Then I started shopping for the yarn required for the patterns: three trips to yarn shops plus two online vendors for some very specific colors and types of yarn. I am proud to say I've finished two and a half hats...but I have yarn for at least a half dozen more patterns. The running joke among us crafters is that shopping for the yarn and knitting the project are two entirely different hobbies. But the yarn doesn't serve its purpose if it is never knit.

Sometimes our faith lives can feel that same way. We spend a lot of time studying scripture and listening to (or preaching) sermons, but that's only the first half of our calling; putting all of that spiritual knowledge into practice in our daily lives is the reason why we study in the first place. We spend time each week in worship, so we've got the "loving God" part down, but Jesus tells us that loving our neighbors is inextricably linked to that same commandment.

A friend's church uses the terminology of a "second hour" to talk about deepening faith formation and practice. If we think of worship, gathering around word and sacrament, as our "first hour" then a good question to ask is What are we going to do with our second hour? Serve on a committee, help with a meal, facilitate a youth event, make an LWR quilt, attend a fellowship event? There are plenty of ways to grow, even in just one more hour—and plenty of folks already spending a second hour (or third, or fourth...) who would love to share that time with someone who hasn't tried it before.

What might you "knit" with the "yarn" you've collected? A cold world waits to find out.


HIGHLIGHTS BY COUNCIL IN SEPTEMBER


