We are taught to give God our first fruits as a sign of trust that God will provide for us, but observing a day of Thanksgiving at the end of the year lets us look back at how abundantly we have been blessed—and to look forward with renewed energy to continue giving of ourselves out of gratitude.

2022 Veterans

Veteran's Day originated as "Armistice Day" on November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and November 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Veteran's



Day is not to be confused with Memorial Day-a common misunderstanding, according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Memorial Day (the fourth Monday in May) honors American service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle, while Veteran's Day pays tribute to all American veterans-living or dead-but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

On Sunday, November 6th, St. Matthew will honor veterans who have served in the military. Please check the list below of veterans who have served in the military. All veterans will be honored, including inactive and deceased. 
Mitten Tree





HIGHLIGHTS BY COUNCIL IN OCTOBER

- 1. The stewardship initiative will begin on November 6 and continue until the congregational meeting in December with announcements before worship each Sunday, bulletin inserts, and mailings to encourage members to set a giving goal for 2023.
- 2. Year to date, the congregation is experiencing a \$39,000 deficit in giving as compared to expenses and is approximately \$9,000 behind the Benevolence pledge.
- 3. The family of Steve Ayers sent a memorial gift and a letter with complimentary comments about the relationship that Steve shared with the St. Matthew congregation.
- 4. Youth will participate in the liturgy monthly. They will also make candy as a fundraiser in December and plan for a Christmas program during worship on December 18.
- 5. The social ministry committee is planning to help with the community meal at the Church of God on November 14.
- 6. The finance committee is working on the 2023 budget.
- 7. Communion will be offered at the front of the sanctuary during the festival Sundays for the rest of the year, then weekly starting in January 2023.
- 8. There will be a fellowship meal following the service on November 6.
- 9. Completion of the technology project in the fellowship hall is scheduled for October 17.
- 10. The nominating committee is seeking candidates for Council president, vice president, and secretary, and 2 nominating committee members.
