Dear Siblings in Christ:

As we near the end of the calendar year, our thoughts turn toward harvest and the Thanksgiving holiday. Although it's logical to look back in gratitude, counting the blessings that we have enjoyed throughout the year, it's worth noting that scripture teaches a different model of thanksgiving. God commanded giving from the "first fruits" of the harvest. Instead of waiting to see the total yield from crops and giving a portion back in thanksgiving, God asks for an offering right at the beginning of the harvest, an act of trust that the rest of the harvest will be sufficient.

This was no small request from the ancient Israelites who received God's law when they were just moving into the Promised Land. After 40 years eating manna in the dessert, it would an understatement to say that they were out of practice as farmers. In fact, the generation that left Egypt would not have survived to show their children and grandchildren how to sow, tend, and reap. The land in which they were settling was unknown to them, and their ancestors had left it in the midst of a famine. It may have seemed a small miracle to them to have successfully raised food in this new place for the first time. Giving up the very first produce of their labor was a risk that required them to trust God's continuing provision.

We have never tasted manna, the daily gift of bread from heaven, but maybe when we look back over our year, we can see the ways in which God has provided for our physical, mental, and spiritual wellbeing. If we can practice gratitude now, as our year draws to a close, we can find the inspiration to look forward, trusting that God will continue to get us through the next year, taking the risk of giving ourselves in service to the one who has given so abundantly to us.



2021 Veterans

Veteran's Day originated as "Armistice Day" on November 11, 1919, the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual



observance, and November 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Veteran's Day is not to be confused with Memorial Day—a common misunderstanding, according to the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Memorial Day (the fourth Monday in May) honors American service members who died in service to their country or as a result of injuries incurred during battle, while Veteran's Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

On Sunday, November 7th, St. Matthew will honor veterans who have served in the military. Please check the list below of veterans who have served in the military. All veterans will be honored, including inactive and deceased. If you know of someone who is missing from the list, or you have a family member you wish to be honored during the service, please contact Lori in the church office as soon as possible.

Several churches will provide turkey and food for Thanksgiving dinners that families can prepare themselves.



A Stewardship Minute

November 2021

Frank Jones was a widower in his nineties. He tried to make ends meet on a small pension he received. Frank lived all alone, yet his pastor was surprised that Frank never felt lonely. Indeed, the pastor learned that every day Frank had visitors. The mailman would go into his home where he was greeted warmly and given a cup of tea or coffee. During the day, lonely widows and widowers came to visit. They always left renewed and spiritually uplifted. In the afternoon children would visit, be greeted warmly and leave smiling. Even one college student found that he was blessed after visiting with Frank. The old saint was like a loving friend or grandfather to them all. When people left his presence, most were grinning with joy.

The pastor himself found that somehow old Frank seemed to draw him to visit often. "How are you, Frank?", the pastor would always ask as he entered the door. The answer was always the same, "I'm still the cheerful old Frank Jones." And the minister knew it was so. Invariably, when the chatting, laughing and praying were about to end, Frank would take an envelope and ask the pastor to take his offering to the church for him. Knowing that Frank was financially strapped, the minister would say, "Frank, it is wonderful of you to want to give to your church, but the church is doing well financially right now and it would be all right if you met some of your own needs."

Frank's answer was always the same. "You don't understand. I'm glad the church is doing well, but I *need* to give God my offering." He knew that loving and giving cheerfully were necessary for a healthy spiritual life!

Prayer: We are indeed glad, dear Lord, that you shower us regularly with abundant blessings. Give us generous and loving hearts that we may make evident our willingness to be your servants and spread joy through your Kingdom. **Amen**

Nominating Committee – Needs Volunteers (2) - responsible for the new slate of members for Council each year. Usually, meets once in October and November.






