Greetings People of God:

September 10th marks the 10th anniversary of God's Work, Our Hands Sunday, the ELCA's initiative to extend the work of the congregation in worship to service in God's world. Whether congregations' projects are begun in the church buildings and shared with far away partners (like making LDR emergency kits) or congregations walk out of the doors and engage in service in their immediate communities, this Sunday is an opportunity for us as Lutherans to be witnesses of God's transforming love to our neighbors, near and far.

Historically, the Christian church has not always done a great job of modeling God's gift of grace and no-strings-attached love. I hope you will join me in this year's project, brightening up the neighborhood with flowers, as a way to remind both ourselves and others that we strive to live well together for no reason other than that Jesus taught us to love our neighbors as ourselves—with no strings attached, just like the love we ourselves have received from God.

A Stewardship Minute SEPTEMBER 2023

A story in this month's *Stewardship* tells of people that wanted to build a bridge over a river. On one side of the river they found bedrock that was not very deep. That meant the stanchion or pillar could easily be built there. On the other side, however, the bedrock was at a depth of 110 feet. Naturally that was going to be a problem for them, yet they came up with a solution. They decided to make a long and large metal pipe that would be placed on the bedrock, then fill it with concrete. Thus they had the two stanchions to serve as the foundations for the building of the bridge. The bridge ultimately was built and is there to cross this very day.

The writer makes the point that just as the bridge needed a good foundation, so too, as Christians we need to have a foundation on which we can build a life pleasing to God; a firm foundation to live as Christians. And that foundation is our Christ our Lord. Jesus, telling his listeners that if they called him Lord and followed his teachings, they would be like the man who built his house on a rock foundation. When a flood came, his house would not be washed away. Then our Lord said if a person did not build a house on a strong foundation, when a flood came, it would be washed away. And great would be the ruin of that house. If we decide to truly call Christ "Lord" and do what he teaches, then we too will have a strong foundation that will not only last us all the days of our lives, but also we will find our Lord saying to us "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joy of your Master."

On November 1, 1993, Loretta (Lori) Tremmel stepped into St. Matthew Lutheran Church as the newly hired Administrative Assistant, leaving behind her fifteen-year business of selling aboveground swimming pools. Desiring a change, Lori interviewed for the position and was initially overlooked for two other applicants. However, it was St. Matthew's blessing that the others rejected, and Lori accepted the job because she dedicated nearly 30 years of her life to an employment opportunity which provided reliability and stability in the church office.

Interim-Pastor, Harry Stetser, was Lori's first supervisor and mentor. She recalled that he did not just answer her questions but educated her about "Lutheranism" since she was a devout Catholic. Nonetheless, Pastor Stetser was only her first supervisor. There were six additional pastorates during Lori's tenure, including the Rev. Tim Knauss, the Rev Jack Timm and co-pastor the Rev. Judy Simonson, the Rev. Scott Schul, the Rev. Ed Harshbarger and co-pastor the Rev Judy Simonson, the Rev. Suzanne Morelli, and presently the Rev. Traci Marriott. Lori became very adaptable over the years with not only the changes in pastors but also with the improvements in technology and software.

When she started at St. Matthew, Lori was required to heat the copy paper in the microwave before attempting to duplicate on the desk-top copier. Unfortunately, the temperature of the microwave was not articulated, and Lori was able to replicate the Lord's burning bush in the microwave. No real harm was done, and Lori was privileged to use updated office equipment and technology in later years. She conveniently worked from home during the COVID-19 Pandemic by employing online services, something that would not have been possible during the early 1990's.

Never missing an opportunity, Lori assumed the Sexton duties in addition to the office responsibilities at St. Matthew when the custodian resigned. For several years she worked during the early part of the day as Administrative Assistant and cleaned the church in afternoon or weekend hours. Likewise, at one period of time while working at St. Matthew, Lori moonlighted at the Penn Mont Academy and even coached the women's bowling team at Penn State, Altoona. Becoming a professional bowler, Lori was inducted into the Pennsylvania and Altoona Bowling Halls of Fame. When the Martinsburg Food Pantry and Scout Troop #358 needed clerical help, Lori met the challenge to help the organizations. Always, Lori demonstrated a work ethic that was unmatched by most. Yet somehow, she found time to share the parenting of three sons with her husband, Joey, as well as caring for parents and other family members and welcoming four grandchildren.

It did not take long for Lori to become one of the St. Matthew family through her interactions with the members and the community. She even became a Lutheran during her employment years. Looking back over her career, Lori stated that she most enjoyed watching the children of the church grow into adults, realizing many positive accomplishments. However, just as we mourned with her when she lost her oldest son so early in his life, Lori sadly misses many members who are no longer with us but were once active and involved in St. Matthew's ministry.

As Lori begins a new chapter in her life's journey, the people of St. Matthew express their sincere appreciation for her many years of diligent service and wish her a retirement blessed with good health and happiness.



HIGHLIGHTS BY COUNCIL IN AUGUST 2023

- 1. Sunday School teachers will meet later in August to review curriculum and plan for Rally Day in September.
- 2. The Civic Life and Faith Social Statement Study is scheduled to begin on August 17. Locations have been scheduled for each week among St. Matthew, St. Luke, Claysburg, and Newry. The congregation is invited to participate in any or all meetings.
- 3. Progress continues for getting all the required paperwork, approvals, and permits to install the new chairlift from the main entrance level to the fellowship hall.
- 4. After assessment of the deterioration of the concrete steps, ramp, and sidewalks at the Maple Street entrance, an engineer was engaged to develop specifications for the project. Bids for the concrete work will be solicited.
- 5. Accepted Lori Tremmel's intention to retire in September and made plans for filling the vacancy.
- 6. There will be a reception recognizing Lori Tremmel's years of service as St. Matthew's administrative assistant.
- 7. Approved by consensus the St. Matthew Child Protection Policy.
