**PERSEVERANCE** 

#### Dear People of God:

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God. [Hebrews 12:1-2 NRSV]

I have never been much of a runner; in my whole life, I've only ever chosen to participate in a few 5K's, nothing longer and certainly not for the purpose of serious competition (which is good, because I would have lost). One of my few attempts ended unimpressively after I trained on the flat, paved battlefield road around Gettysburg then ran up and down hills and through muddy trails on the 5K course at Sequanota. I should have trained on more rugged terrain or chosen a gentler race.

These days I find myself in what feels like an unexpected long-distance endeavor, with the added challenge of having no idea how much farther I have to go. Our pandemic experience has lasted longer than any of us envisioned, and we may have a significant struggle yet in front of us before this time is "over"...not that we even really know what "over" will look like. We didn't have much preparation for life under these constrained conditions: limiting our social interactions with friends and family; adjusting to work or school online or behind masks; forgoing travel, concerts, sporting events, corporate worship. We weren't ready for this, and we're ready for it to be over.

Yet scripture calls us to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us" which acknowledges that the race we get is not always the race we want. The task before us now is to act out of an abundance of caution and care for others. It's not what we planned for; it's not what we would choose; and sadly, it's not over. But as Christians, we are called to radical love that puts other people's needs above our own desires, following Jesus' example of forgoing every power and privilege in order to be the servant of humankind. We are called to keep running, even though it's hard, even though we may feel ill-prepared, even though we're tired. We are still called to the work of loving others, not in the ideal circumstances we wish we were experiencing, but in the real struggle that has been set before us.

The good news is that God promises to be with us, not just in ideal conditions, but always. May we find our strength in the One who bore the weight of the world and continues to hold us gently in infinitely loving arms.

#### **OUTDOOR WORSHIP SERVICE**

An outdoor worship service is planned for **Sunday, September 13, 2020 at 10 a.m.,** at the Ed Kreider Farm. Directions to the Kreider Farm are below:



**Directions:** From Martinsburg, take 164 East to Fredericksburg. Turn **left** on Clover Creek road and follow for 2¾ miles to Kreider Lane on the right.

### Guidelines to follow if you plan to attend worship on September 13th:

- --Bring your own chair.
- --Print your bulletin or use electronic device (download and save the file before the service; cell coverage is at a minimum at the farm). If you bring a paper bulletin, take it home with you.
- --Hand sanitizer will be available.
- --No rest room facilities will be available unless for an emergency.
- --The service will not be live streamed but will be recorded and uploaded shortly after the service is over.
- --You are required to wear a mask. If you are unable to wear a mask, we invite you to continue worshiping online. (Masks will be available in case you forget yours.)
- --Your name and contact information will be recorded (in case contact tracing becomes necessary).
- --Wear appropriate clothing and shoes so you are comfortable in an outdoor setting.
- --If it rains, the service will be live streamed at the church and recorded as usual. We will not meet in person. Lori will send an email indicating cancellation of the outdoor worship if it is raining.
- --The worship service will include communion. Pre-packaged wafers and wine will be prepared and placed on a table for you to pick up before the worship service. Following the service you can discard packaging in the trash can provided.
- --Practice social distancing. Whenever possible keep at least six feet from anyone who is not part of your own household. We realize it has been a while since most of us have seen each other, but refrain from the urge to hug or shake hands. A simple wave and hello is good.
- --Even though we are gathering outdoors, if you are exhibiting symptoms, awaiting test results, or have been in contact with someone who may have been exposed to the virus, you will need to stay at home. We invite you to worship digitally.

We are looking forward to this unique worship experience.

#### HIGHLIGHTS BY COUNCIL IN JULY

- 1. Council agreed to split the final disbursement of the Rosamond Smith Bequest into two funds: \$14,997 to The Thrivent Diversified Income Plus for the Youth and \$14,997 to Thrivent Income Fund to be used as needed.
- 2. Council agreed to accept the recommendation from Staff Support to no longer distribute the Monthly Messenger and any other bulk mailings by US Postal Service except for those that do not have internet (24). This will save the church approximately \$1,200 annually.
