FIRST READING: 1 Samuel 3:1-10 [11-20]

¹Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

²At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; ³the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. ⁴Then the Lord called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" ⁵and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. ⁶The Lord called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." ⁷Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. ⁸The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. ⁹Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.'" So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

¹⁰Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." [¹¹Then the Lord said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. ¹²On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. ¹³For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. ¹⁴Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever."

¹⁵Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Lord. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. ¹⁶But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." ⁵We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. ⁶For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

⁷But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. ⁸We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; ⁹persecuted,

but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; ¹⁰always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. ¹¹For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. ¹²So death is at work in us, but life in you.



The Property Committee and Church Council have been discussing the possibility of selling the Grange parking lot. The purpose of this correspondence is to furnish the congregation with information related to the property, including considerations of why we should or should not sell it, and to provide church members the opportunity for feedback.

The lot is located two houses away from the church at the corner of South Wall Street and Woodlawn Avenue. The dimensions of the property are 50 feet wide by 150 feet long. In 2009, the church spent \$32,500 to purchase the property; at that time, the Grange Hall building was still on the lot. We then spent about \$8,000 to tear down the building. In total, we have spent over \$40,000 for what is now a stoned parking lot.

Some reasons to consider selling:

- 1) Heaven forbid there would be an accident, we could be held responsible.
- 2) The cost of liability insurance for the lot is \$50 per year, which is not a lot of money but is still an expense.
- 3) We pay our Sexton to shovel and snow-blow the sidewalk in front of the lot. When we need the lot (i.e., for a large funeral) on a day when there has been snow accumulation, we pay a contractor \$100 an hour to clear it.
- 4) Our church expenses have exceeded our income in each of the last two years by over \$42,000. Selling the lot could be one way to turn a liability into an asset.

Some reasons for retaining the Grange parking lot:

- 1) The property was purchased with the intent of razing the structure to create additional parking for St Matthew. The lot continues to be used for this intended purpose as overflow parking when there is a large gathering, most frequently for funerals or special services in the sanctuary and social events in the fellowship hall.
- 2) Like the church building and adjacent parking lot, the Grange lot is an asset to the church in the form of real property.
- 3) The property is not expected to decrease in value.
- 4) No other property is currently available in the vicinity of the church.
