#### **EUCHARISTIC PRAYER & WORDS OF INSTITUTION**


- P Holy God, the Beginning and the End, our Salvation and our Hope, we praise you for creating a world of order and beauty.






#### **PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION**

- 2) Click on the "Give" button, (on the top white banner)
- 3) Follow the onscreen instructions to create an online profile and to schedule your recurring contributions.
- **Mobile Giving:** Giving online is easy and allows you to set up automatic recurring contributions. Electronic giving offers convenience for individuals and provides much-needed donation consistency for our congregation. Simply follow these easy steps:
- 1) Visit "Play Store on your mobile device"
- 2) Find the "Vanco Payment" app (this is free)
- 3) Click on the "Install" button
- 4) Open the app on your device
- 5) Follow the onscreen instructions to schedule your one time contribution or recurring contributions. (*There is a processing fee at the time of the transaction. You have the choice to pay the fee for the church or have the fee taken from your donation.*)
